Background (for facilitators only): Ms LaBlanche is a 88 year-old woman admitted last night with heart failure. She has been short of breath all morning.

Her nurse checks on her and finds her unresponsive.

Supplies Required

 IV and oxygen supplies crash cart simulators: IV, CPR mannikin	

To share with primary nurse: Mel LaBlanche is a 88 year-old woman admitted last night for heart failure. She has a past history of myocardial infarction, (2010), COPD, type II diabetes.

She has been short of breath all morning, requiring increased levels of oxygen.

Her vitals this morning were pulse 96, BP 124/88, RR 18, sats 88% on 4L, afebrile.

You are checking on her routinely.
